

TRAVELLING INSTRUCTION TO NÖTÖ

WEEKEND TRIP FROM FRIDAY TO SUNDAY

LOCATION AND FERRY-TRIP

The island of Nötö is located in the middle of the Archipelago National Park about 20 km from Nauvo to the south. The island is reachable by ferry MS Baldur. Ferry departs from Nauvo's Pärnäs on Friday at 18.15 and arrives to Nötö around 20.00. On Sunday ferry back to Pärnäs leaves from Nötö at 15.50 and arrives to Pärnäs at 18.00. Ferry trip to the island is free of charge.

HOW TO GET TO PÄRNÄS

Pärnäs (also Pärnäinen) in Nauvo can be reached from Turku by The archipelago bus 901-904. On Friday, the bus (*Skärgårdsbuss 902*) departs from Turku Bus Station at 15.10 and arrives to Pärnäs at 16.53.

On Sunday a bus to Turku leaves from Pärnäs after ferry has arrived at 18.25 and arrives to Turku at 20.15. (Bus tickets from Matkahuolto).

Pärnäs harbour can also be reached via the Archipelago road by own car. Calculate for a car trip from Turku minimum 2.5 hours, islands connecting ferry can cause delay. There is a free parking in harbour.

WEEKEND TRIP FROM THURSDAY TO SUNDAY

LOCATION AND FERRY-TRIP

The island of Nötö is located in the middle of the Archipelago National Park about 20 km from Nauvo to the south. The island is reachable by ferry MS Baldur. Ferry departs from Nauvo's Pärnäs on Thursday at 13.30 and arrives to Nötö around 15.00. On Sunday ferry back to Pärnäs leaves from Nötö at 15.50 and arrives to Pärnäs at 18.00. Ferry trip to the island is free of charge.

HOW TO GET TO PÄRNÄS

Pärnäs (also Pärnäinen) in Nauvo can be reached from Turku by The archipelago bus 901-904. On Thursday, the bus (*Skärgårdsbuss 902*) departs from Turku Bus Station at 11.10 and arrives to Pärnäs at 12.53.

On Sunday a bus to Turku leaves from Pärnäs after ferry has arrived at 18.25 and arrives to Turku at 20.15. (Bus tickets from Matkahuolto).

Pärnäs harbour can also be reached via the Archipelago road by own car. Calculate for a car trip from Turku minimum 2.5 hours, islands connecting ferry can cause delay. There is a free parking in harbour.
